if abraham lincoln was known as the great emancipator he was also the only president to suspend the writ of habeas corpus indeed lincoln s record on the constitution and individual rights has fueled a century of debate from charges that democrats were singled out for harrassment to gore vidal s depiction of lincoln as an absolute dictator now in the pulitzer prize winning the fate of liberty one of america s leading authorities on lincoln wades straight into this controversy showing just who was jailed and why even as he explores the whole range of lincoln s constitutional policies mark neely depicts lincoln s suspension of habeas corpus as a well intentioned attempt to deal with a floodtide of unforeseen events the threat to washington as maryland flirted with secession disintegrating public order in the border states corruption among military contractors the occupation of hostile confederate territory contraband trade with the south and the outcry against the first draft in u s history drawing on letters from prisoners records of military courts and federal prisons memoirs and federal archives he paints a vivid picture of how lincoln responded to these problems how his policies were actually executed and the virulent political debates that followed lincoln emerges from this account with this legendary statesmanship intact mindful of political realities and prone to temper the sentences of military courts concerned not with persecuting his opponents but with prosecuting the war

efficiently in addition neely explores the abuses of power under the regime of martial law the routine torture of suspected deserters widespread antisemitism among union generals and officials the common practice of seizing civilian hostages he finds that though the system of military justice was flawed it suffered less from merciless zeal or political partisanship than from inefficiency and the friction and complexities of modern war informed by a deep understanding of a unique period in american history this incisive book takes a comprehensive look at the issues of civil liberties during lincoln s administration placing them firmly in the political context of the time written with keen insight and an intimate grasp of the original sources the fate of liberty offers a vivid picture of the crises and chaos of a nation at war with itself changing our understanding of this president and his most controversial policies

the essays in this book focus on lincoln s views on the rule of law and the constitution and expose the difficulty and ambiguity associated with the protection of civil rights during the civil war

to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the end of the civil war diversion books is publishing seminal works of the era stories told by the men and women who led who fought and who lived in an america that had come apart at the seams the first entry in the comprehensive collection of the writings from the sixteenth president this volume cover his years in the illinois house of representatives at the beginning of a nascent political career that would eventually take him into the white house and the country into its most tumultuous period

when the american people went to war in 1861 the task and the duty of maintaining the foundation principles of the republican experiment were in jeopardy the question of if and how these principles should be preserved was of pressing importance the outcome of the war could require the republican government to be transformed in order to strengthen the union or conversely if the war created the revolutionary situation that at times seemed pending new principles for the resulting new nation would have to be formed as it emerged from the destruction and dislocation of the war these were the issues to bear on the constitution during the civil war these were the dilemmas facing president lincoln this book by one of the nation s leading constitutional historians analyzes the nature and tendency of american constitutionalism during the nation s greatest political crisis in a series of related essays herman belz combines detailed narrative with probing judicial analysis of the political thought of abraham lincoln his exercise of executive power and the application of the equality principle which would become a central issue during reconstruction belz s essays are interdisciplinary in their approach combining history political science and jurisprudence to study the political and constitutional climate and the changes which occurred under lincoln during and after the war belz studies lincoln as the focus of both contemporary political controversy and subsequent historical debate over the conservative or revolutionary character of civil war constitutionalism he explores the politically controversial nature of the equality principle that lay at the heart of the slavery struggle and its resolution in wartime emancipation

the stirring history of a president and a capital city on the front lines of war and freedom in the late 1840s representative abraham lincoln resided at mrs sprigg s boardinghouse on capitol hill known as abolition house mrs sprigg s hosted lively dinner table debates of antislavery politics by the congressional boarders the unusually rapid turnover in the enslaved staff suggested that there were frequent escapes north to freedom from abolition house likely a cog in the underground railroad these early years in washington proved formative for lincoln in 1861 now in the white house lincoln could gaze out his office window and see the confederate flag flying across the potomac washington dc sat on the front lines of the civil war vulnerable and insecure the capital was rife with confederate sympathizers on the crossroads of slavery and freedom the city was a refuge for thousands of contraband and fugitive slaves the lincoln administration took strict measures to tighten security and established camps to provide food shelter and medical care for contrabands in 1863 a freedman s village rose on the grounds of the lee estate where the confederate flag once flew

the president and mrs lincoln personally comforted the wounded troops who flooded wartime washington in 1862 lincoln spent july 4 riding in a train of ambulances carrying casualties from the peninsula campaign to washington hospitals he saluted the one legged brigade assembled outside the white house as orators their wounds eloquent expressions of sacrifice and dedication the administration built more than one hundred military hospitals to care for union casualties these are among the unforgettable scenes in lincoln s citadel a fresh absorbing narrative history of lincoln s leadership in civil war washington here is the vivid story of how the lincoln administration met the immense challenges the war posed to the city transforming a vulnerable capital into a bastion for the union
