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the study of heresy and heterodoxy and of belief in magic witchcraft and the devil has in the past 25 years made significant advances in our understanding of art and iconography ideas mentality and belief and ordinary life and popular imagination in the patristic and medieval periods at the forefront of research into this aspect of medieval intellectual history has been jeffrey b russell whose numerous books and articles have opened important new paths in the field to mark his retirement 17 established and emerging scholars from europe and north america historians of art the church religions and ideas have contributed papers on the many areas which russell has influenced topics dealt with include elves the christians apocrypha mysticism sexuality heresies and heresiologies apocalyptic tracts astrology hell and other christian encounters with non believers these essays are offered as tribute to the deep impact that russel has had on medieval studies contributors include alan bernstein richard emmerson alberto ferreiro neil forsyth abraham friessen karen jolly henry ansgar kelly richard kieckhefer beverly m kienzle garry macy bernard mcginn edward peters cheryl rigs larry j simon laura smoller catherine b tkacz and john tolan

this book breaks with three common scholarly barriers of periodization discipline and geography in its exploration of the related themes of heresy magic and witchcraft it sets aside constructed chronological boundaries and in doing so aims to achieve a clearer picture of what went before as well as what came after thus the volume demonstrates continuity as well as change in the concepts and understandings of magic heresy and witchcraft in addition the geographical pattern of similarities and diversities suggests a comparative approach transcending confessional as well as national borders throughout the medieval and early modern period the orthodoxy of the christian church was continuously contested the challenge of heterodoxy especially as expressed in various kinds of heresy magic and witchcraft was constantly present during the period 1200 1650 neither contesters nor followers of orthodoxy were homogeneous groups or fractions they themselves and their ideas changed from one century to the next from region to region even from city to city but within a common framework of interpretation this collection of essays focuses on this complex

in the fifteenth century many authorities did not believe inquisitors stories of a supposed satanic witch sect however the religious conflict of the sixteenth century reformation especially popular movements of reform and revolt helped to create an atmosphere in which diabolical conspiracies which swept up religious dissidents jews and magicians into their nets were believed to pose a very real threat fear of the devil and his followers inspired horrific incidents of judicially approved terror in early modern europe

leading after 1560 to the infamous witch hunts bringing together the fields of reformation and witchcraft studies this fascinating book reveals how the early modern period's religious conflicts led to widespread confusion and uncertainty gary k waite examines in depth how church leaders dispelled rising religious doubt by persecuting heretics and how alleged infernal plots and witches who confessed to making a pact with the devil helped the authorities to reaffirm orthodoxy waite argues that it was only when the authorities came to terms with pluralism that there was a corresponding decline in witch panics

the fifteenth century is more than any other the century of the persecution of witches so wrote johan huizinga more than eighty years ago in his classic *autumn of the middle ages* although huizinga was correct in his observation modern readers have tended to focus on the more spectacular witch hunts of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries nevertheless it was during the late middle ages that the full stereotype of demonic witchcraft developed in europe and this is the subject of *battling demons at the heart of the story* is johannes nider d 1438 a dominican theologian and reformer who alternately persecuted heretics and negotiated with them a man who was by far the most important church authority to write on witchcraft in the early fifteenth century nider was a major source for the infamous *malleus maleficarum* or hammer of witches 1486 the manual of choice for witch hunters in late medieval europe today nider's reputation rests squarely on his witchcraft writings but in his own day he was better known as a leader of the reform movement within the dominican order and as a writer of important tracts on numerous other aspects of late medieval religiosity including heresy and lay piety *battling demons* places nider in this wider context showing that for late medieval thinkers witchcraft was one facet of a much larger crisis plaguing christian society as the only english language study to focus exclusively on the rise of witchcraft in the early fifteenth century *battling demons* will be important to students and scholars of the history of magic and witchcraft and medieval religious history

in its characterization of witches as a devil worshipping and mostly female heretical sect the kyteler case as prosecuted by richard de ledrede in 1324 serves as an exceptional model for later continental witchcraft trials and consequently has been discussed by several historians of the subject due to its isolation in time and place however it rarely receives more than a cursory analysis in their studies and because of its isolation in nature it has not fared better with historians of ireland though it did not provide a

paradigm for witchcraft persecution in ireland it stands at the center of several heresy trials on the island in the fourteenth century two trials occurred in 1310 one against the templars and another against a canon of holy trinity cathedral four heresy proceedings followed in the five years after the kyteler case three of them also initiated by ledrede the fourth prosecuted against adduce dubh o toole for a heresy which amounts to systematic denial of the catholic faith was used by colonists in a request to the pope for a crusade against the native irish in order to complete the aims of laudabiliter the papal bull which had sanctioned ireland s conquest by henry ii despite this plea and despite three successive popes repeated instructions that the investigation of the anglo irish heretics ledrede claimed to have discovered in dublin and ossory be continued no trial seems to have occurred until 1353 and then in the diocese of killaloe against two men of the macconmaras tried like the case of adducc dubh by colonists who had recently defeated them in war by exploring the kyteler case within the context of these trials this dissertation brings significant issues to the forefront such as the relations between the english the irish and the anglo irish and the role of the church in these relations the doctrinal as well as the political and cultural aspects of the heresies the gender dynamics revealed in the kyteler case and the colony and the impact of heresy and witchcraft on a land that previously had little experience of either

written and published in 1486 by german catholic clergyman heinrich kramer this treatise was republished with additions from a second author jacob sprenger in 1519 used to persecute supposed practisers of witchcraft during the witch hunts of the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries the malleus maleficarum is a haunting reminder of the deep seated paranoia and religious fervour that led to the torture and deaths of many innocent people one of history s most infamous texts this handbook struck fear into the hearts of many and fuelled the flames of hysteria surrounding ideas of heresy witchcraft and the occult during the middle ages this is the 1928 edition translated by the english occultist montague summers and featuring his original introduction

the study of the conflict between religious orthodoxy and heresy in the middle ages has long been a controversial field though the sectarian differences of the past have faded in intensity the varieties of academic correctness that today inform historical studies are equally likely to give rise to a number of interpretations sometimes providing more information about the sympathies of contemporary historians than the beliefs feelings and actions of medieval people in this book jeffrey burton russell provides a fresh overview of the subject from the council of chalcedon 451 a d to the eve of the protestant reformation the fruit of many years of thought and scholarship dissent and order in the middle ages is a concise introduction to the full range of religious and social phenomena encompassed by the book s title while tracing the intellectual battles that raged between the champions of orthodoxy and the partisans of dissent russell grounds these conflicts which often seem rather recondite to the modern reader in the evolving social context of medieval europe in addition to discussing conflicts within christianity russell sheds new light on such vexing topics as the origin of anti semitism and the persecution of alleged witches more than just an overview russell s study is also an original interpretation of a complex subject russell sees the conflict between dissent and order not as a war of binary opposites but rather as an ongoing dialectic a creative tension that despite the excesses it entailed on both sides was essential to the development of christianity without this creative tension russell argues christianity might well have stagnated and possibly died dissent and order then are perhaps best seen as symbiotically joined aspects of a single living healthy organism dissent and order in the middle ages will appeal to and challenge all readers interested in european history from beginning students to seasoned scholars as well as those concerned with christianity s past and future

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
